THIS FALL IN CHOPR HISTORY

The Report to Congress on the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) <u>Graduate Nurse Education</u> (<u>GNE</u>) <u>Demonstration</u> was released last week and shows how the <u>GNE</u> <u>demonstration had a positive impact on APRN growth</u> and helped transform

clinical education within participating GNE schools of nursing. Now, GNE nurse leaders are turning to Congress to urge lawmakers to sponsor a 2-year extension. History tells us the push

for funding to educate more APRNs began a half-century ago when Medicare legislation was first established. Although there had been several attempts to reform Medicare support of Graduate Medical Education (GME), it took until the Balanced Budget Act of 1995 for the Ways and Means Committee of the U.S. House of Representatives to ask Institute of Medicine (IOM) officials to examine and report on GME fund distribution. The Committee on Implementing a National GME Trust Fund was assembled. Its members represented different perspectives in the fields of medical education, health services delivery, and policy, and included Dr. Aiken among

their ranks. The commission met, solicited written comments from health organizations, and hosted a public hearing of nine associations. Following the National Academies Press report from the IOM, Dr. Aiken headed to Washington, DC in the Fall of 1998

with other nurse leaders to tell the National Bipartisan Commission on the Future of Medicare GME Study Group that Medicare reform needed to include GME payments for APNs. "The commission should revise Medicare payment policies governing reimbursement of

nursing education", said Dr. Aiken, and much like today, asked them to retarget funding to advanced clinical training for licensed RNs at the graduate level. Early CHOPR papers/news are listed below with links:
