"Multisite Replication of the Transitional Care Model"

The goal of this study is to replicate the Transitional Care Model (TCM) randomized control trial findings from prior work. Four health organizations with nine hospitals across the US will participate in the trial. A total of 1600 patients with heart failure, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease and/or pneumonia will be enrolled by the sites with 800 randomly assigned to the standard care group and 800 randomly assigned to the TCM intervention group. The Penn team will train all trial staff to screen, enroll and implement the TCM. Our team is responsible for monitoring and supporting sites in the execution of the trial and implementation of TCM intervention.
