IMPORTANT NOTES:

*NHCM students must complete 2 General Education requirements (1 Social Science, 1 Humanities) and 2 Cross-Cultural Perspectives requirements. These courses can be taken in any order and must be fulfilled with liberal arts courses (no business, nursing, or natural science, math and engineering). Consult with a Wharton advisor for more information.

**In addition to STAT 1010 & 1020, Wharton Business Fundamentals include ACCT 1010, ACCT 1020, BEPP 2500, FNCE 1000, FNCE 1010, MGMT 1010, MKTG 1010, OIDD 1010. NURS 3300 fulfills the LGST 1000/1010 requirement. Students progress through these courses in a variety of different ways depending on their own strengths and interests. Consult with an advisor to develop the pathway that fits best for you.

***NURS 4000 fulfills Wharton's Senior Capstone requirement. The course is offered every other spring semester (odd numbered years).

****NURS 3890 fulfills Wharton's Technology, Innovation & Analytics bracket, with prior approval of project

All plans of study are subject to curricular change. Students must consult with an academic advisor prior to making revisions to the plan of study to ensure the necessary curricular requirements are being met and to prevent delays in academic progression. Also, please note that this is just one example of how a student can progress through the NHCM curriculum. There are a number of ways to customize this to individual student interests and needs, including when to begin the nursing clinical sequence, how and when to start the HCMG concentration, etc. Meet with an advisor early and often to discuss your individual path.
