Description: This study seeks to explore what current protocols are in place and/or implemented for gay and bisexual Black and Latino sexual assault survivors who 1) identify as sexual assault survivors and are seeking health care and other supportive services, as a result from the sexual assault, (STD/STI testing, SANE nurses, rape kits) 2) men who are seeking general sexual health care services (general sexual health care, HIV and STI testing, screening) and what cultural and GBM specific services are readily available (medical providers trained in LGBT+ issues, "out" providers, Black and Latino medical care providers), and best practice recommendations (LGBT+ and cultural skills training, additional SANE nurses).

Description: This pilot research project is a community-academic partnership with the Public Health Management Corporation that aims to tackle sexual health disparities that negatively impact transgender and gender nonbinary (TGNB) individuals in Philadelphia. We will employ qualitative interviews to gather community insight into programmatic needs and preferred intervention strategies that address TGNB sexual health and wellness, evaluate differences in programmatic needs and preferences across different age cohorts, and develop a comprehensive set of recommendations for tailored TGNB sexual health and wellness programs for community and clinical stakeholders.

Description: This proposed project will use findings from the Specialty Pharmaceutical Benefits Program stigma survey to inform the development and piloting of a social marketing intervention that strives to reduce HIV-related stigma in order to support testing and improve health outcomes of PLWH. As part of the project, we anticipate developing and evaluating messaging concepts that address HIV-related stigma among PLWH identified in the stigma survey as experiencing the highest levels of stigma under domains of anticipated, enacted, and U=U. The proposed campaign will be designed to reduce intersectional stigma in healthcare and community settings and to support the increase of testing and re-engagement in care among populations in Pennsylvania most at risk for delayed HIV identification and poor HIV-related outcomes.

Lastly, we will organize a conference during the spring of 2023 and convene the network to analyze the data generated from the longitudinal database to identify recommendations

for future implementation efforts across jurisdictions and write a white paper about how the network can advance future computational efforts to advance the EHE goals.

The alliance will involve key stakeholders in rural HIV care within EHE priority states with heavy HIV rural burden, including local government and community agencies, as well as personnel of community colleges and people with lived experience in the same areas. Once the alliance has been formed, this project will provide infrastructure, software, and relevant training in digital health interventions and their delivery, and measure the alliance's adoption of one digital intervention, time to adoption, and delivery of social media messages to promote it.
